Ancient Greeks valued vases and used them for many different reasons, including prizes.

The vases were decorated with scenes from everyday life and mythology. This gives us insight into their values and way of life.

They used black decoration on red clay or red decoration on black clay.


Mosaic tiles were used to decorate buildings.

Over time many people have been inspired by the Art of the Ancient Greeks, eg. statues of Greek mythical characters were sculpted in Victorian times.

The methods the Ancient Greeks developed shaped how we make statues now.

Spanish graffiti artists, Pichi and Avo, have been inspired by these magnificent statues.





vase- a container which can have a variety of uses.

potter- a craftsperson who makes things out of clay.

mosaic tiles - small decorative tiles

statues - a carved or cast figure of humans, animals, mythical creatures often larger than life

graffiti- writing or drawings painted/sprayed on walls or other surface in a public place

chalk- a soft limestone stick used for drawing/
colouring, comes in many colours
