We love to live our School Values and enjoy recognising, and celebrating, with those children who have been great examples of our Values in Action.



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Each Friday we recognise some lovely ways in which pupils have been living our values. These have included showing kindness to others who have been feeling upset, or have been hurt during play, making sure that they are cared for; giving extra help and support to classmates, and making sure people aren't left out at break and lunch times. We have seen examples of respect by offering support and explanations to a talk partner, making them feel more comfortable with understanding the work, helping them to understand the question being asked in English. We have seen children taking responsibility for themselves and their belongings by making sure that cloakrooms are kept tidy, for their work and learning by having positive attitude, for the environment and for school equipment by helping move cones around at playtimes, and manning stationary shop and library. 


## Reading Millionaires




