French History

The French Revolution: (1789-1799)

- During this time France removed the monarchy and became a republic.
- It started with the storming of the Bastille prison in 1789.
- King Louis XVI was imprisoned and later executed.
- France became a republic
- Then began a 'Reign of Terror,' when many people were executed by quillotine.
- Eventually Napoleon took control and became Emperor of France.
- Many of the ideas behind the French Revolution—liberté, égalité, fraternité spread throughout Europe.

The French Resistance:

- During the Second World War, Nazi Germany conquered and occupied France.
- Some French people formed a secret movement to resist the Nazis and fight back.
- The French Resistance was a network of groups fighting to free France.

French Cultural Icons

The Eiffel Tower: Opened in 1889. 330 m tall tower. The most visited tourist attraction in the world.

The Arc de Triomphe: Completed in 1836, this 50m tall arch was commissioned by Napoleon to commemorate his victories in battles.

The Beret: A soft flat round hat traditionally made of wool. Once, commonly worn by many French men.

The Croissant: A rich, buttery bread, shaped into a crescent. Usually enjoyed at breakfast time.

<u>Tintin:</u> A character from a series of very popular French language comic books written by Herge. Later made into cartoons and films.

The Louvre: The most visited art gallery in the world. Home to the Mona Lisa and the Venus de Milo.

The Catacombs of Paris: A burial tomb in Paris, using a large network of tunnels and chambers.

Famous French People

<u>Henri Matisse:</u> (1869-1954) artist, impressionist, famous for 'painting with scissors.'

<u>Claude Monet</u>: (1840-1926) artist, impressionist, famous for his large scale painting of waterlilies.

<u>Josephine Baker:</u> (1906-1975) singer, actress, spy, civil rights activist.

<u>Georges Seurat:</u> (1859-1891) artist specialising in pointillism.

Edith Piaf: (1915 -1963) was a French singer known as 'The Little Sparrow.' One of the country's most widely known international stars.

<u>Marie Curie:</u> (1867-1954) scientist, discovered radium, won 2 Nobel prizes for chemistry and physics.

<u>Claude Debussy:</u> (1862-1918) classical music composer, famous for 'Au Clair de la Lune.'

The Geography of France

France is a large country in Western Europe, which share **borders** with:

Belgium, Luxembourg, Germany, Switzerland, Italy and Spain.

The **Mediterranean Sea** lies to the south, and the **Atlantic Ocean** lies to the west.

Major rivers are the Seine and the Loire.

68 million people live in France.

The capital city is Paris.

The currency is the Euro.

France is divided into 101 departements: 5 are overseas and include Martinique and Guadeloupe.
