Theme 2: Keeping/Staying Safe and Healthy

Year 3	Trusted adults, recognising safe relationships, basic first aid	Disability (understanding different abilities)
Year 4	Online safety, personal boundaries, recognising peer pressure	Sex, Sexual Orientation (discussed in safe relationships)
Year 5	Puberty education, body confidence, healthy decision-making	Sex, Pregnancy and Maternity, Disability
Year 6	Puberty and personal safety, anti-social behaviour, first aid training (CPR, recovery position)	Sex, Gender Reassignment, Disability, Pregnancy and Maternity

Year 3	Friendship conflicts, respecting differences, introduction to gender roles	Sex, Race, Disability

Race and Religion are first introduced in Year 3 and explored in greater depth throughout, ensuring an understanding of diversity and inclusion.

Sex and Gender Stereotypes are introduced through career choices, friendships, and emotional wellbeing topics, building towards understanding gender identity in Year 6.

Sexual Orientation and Different Families are first introduced in Year 4 in discussions about relationships, deepening in Year 5 and 6 to explore laws, equality, and representation.

Disability Awareness is embedded within personal safety, first aid, and understanding diversity from Year 3 onward.

Marriage & Civil Partnerships are explored in Year 5, helping students understand different types of committed relationships.

Pregnancy & Maternity is discussed in Year 5 and 6 in relation to bodily changes, respect, and family structures.

Year 6 ensures a **comprehensive understanding of all 9 characteristics**, linking to realworld applications and laws.
