Key knowledge

Weaving is an ancient craft still carried out today all over the world.

It is, an important skill which enabled the Anglo-Saxons to make clothes and blankets. Craftspeople were highly valued by Anglo-Saxons

The warp is the vertical thread. The weft is the horizontal thread

The thread must be kept taut and finished securely at the back of the weaving board.

The weaving process involves pushing wool over, under, over, under along the warp. This becomes the weft. Alternate on each line.

To learn about historical and modern textile and weaving artists. Understand that weaving can have a practical use and/or be a piece of art that evokes emotion or tells a story.

craft-an activity involving skill in making things by hand Weave-to make fabric by interlacing threads Loom - apparatus for making fabric by weaving warp- the vertical thread in woven fabric vertical - upright, running from top to bottom

weft - the horizontal thread in woven fabric

horizontal-straight across running from left to

right taut-pulled tight, straight textiles - fabric, material

Diedrick Brackens- is a modern American weaver. He is known for his tapestries that explore African American identity and story telling.
